Drama/Musical Camp: Six days, No Net, Youth Theatre Productions

Youth ages 12-21 at start of camp.
July 3-16, 2016 (Sunday to the following Saturday)
Check-in is between 2:00 and 3:00 PM
Checkout will be approximately 4:00 PM
\$375 on or before May 15th, \$440 after May 15th



- One of the primary goals of this camp is to demonstrate the use of the theater arts as a ministry tool.
- Campers will be cast in either the drama or the musical. Drama is usually about 50 minutes in length and the musical is between 60-90 minutes. As an alternative, youth may also choose tech instead, if they wish to assist with lights, sound and sets.
- Maximum participants is 45
- Two local performances will take place July 8th and 9th.
- Following the local performances, the group will board a tour bus and tour until July 16th.
- In 2014 we presented 9 times in 8 days. In 2015, we presented 8 times in 7 days.
- This years tour is scheduled to be in SD, IA and NE. Final schedule will be posted on the camp website. Tour will also include educational/fun stops.
- NOTE: Campers may stay in host homes while on tour.
- Cost includes all expenses except souvenirs and some personal snacks.
- Due to the length of the camp, we will attempt to do some laundry before we leave on tour, but try to bring a couple extra sets of clothes.
